Daughter launches e-petition

and mum to Rheagan, Kyle, STAR Colin Hendry Calum and Niamh, died on July 10,

2009, aged 42. Denise had undergone liposuction in April 2002, but she was left fighting for life after the cosmetic

procedure. She then underwent years of rehab, physiotherapy and corrective surgery. Denise died after she contracted meningitis following a corrective procedure. The petition calls for tighter

regulations for younger people accessing cosmetic surgery, an age limit of 21 on voluntary surgery and stronger eligibility controls for certain procedures.

Town wants help after cement firm axes jobs

Council looks to the Government for special measures

A TOWN council is appealing for special measures after one of the area's biggest employers laid off about a quarter of its workforce. Clitheroe Town Council wants to

secure funding to generate growth in the area and combat redundancies made by Ribblesdale factory



JOBS AXED Hanson Cement

Hanson Cement, which had to make 30 workers redundant at the end of last year and also an-nounced production would have to be cut by 30 per cent.

The job losses were a result of falling demand for cement and changes to EU carbon trading

rules, which mean companies will

have to pay for pollution permits. The council said it was concerned by the news as it was one of the main employers in the town and called for the Government to con-

sider making the Ribble Valley an Enterprise Zone as part of its Plan for Growth. Gary Young, Hanson general manager, said the construction in-dustry had been hit particularly hard by the recession and was tak-

ing longer to recover. He said: "One of the reasons for the redundancies was to look after

the jobs of the remaining people at our Ribblesdale and north Wales sites. The industry is going to drop again this year because the Government is not backing schools and hospital projects, but it should in-crease slowly in 2013."

He said the industry would not pick up until the Government started to make investments in this kind of business but said no more redun-

dancies were on the cards. In response to the town council's request the Department for Busirequest the Department for Busi-ness, Innovation and Skills said it had already provided £12,879,177 of funding to help boost economic growth in Lancashire. It also announced it will be mak-

ing a second round of grants avail-able which would make a positive impact on jobs in East Lancashire.
